The **International Youth Scientific Conference “Plato Is My Friend, but Truth Is Dearer: Experiences and Discourses of Vulnerability, Resilience, and Recovery on the Path towards an Inclusive Society”** is intended to serve as an interdisciplinary platform for scholarly dialogue among young researchers, PhD candidates, doctoral students, and university students who explore contemporary challenges through the lens of the humanities.

In the context of global crises, wartime transformations, and social vulnerability, particular relevance is gained by the analysis of linguistic, literary, philosophical, cultural, religious, and educational practices as resources for fostering resilience, recovery, and an inclusive society. - History and politics of memory as a space of struggle for subjectivity and the future
- Texts, discourses, meanings: interdisciplinary approaches to the study of vulnerability, resilience, and recovery
- Media discourse and public language in contexts of social vulnerability and transformation
- Contemporary pedagogical practices under conditions of vulnerability, resilience, and the formation of an inclusive society
